1. THE SCHOOL OF LIBERAL STUDIES

The School - launched its undergraduate programme in Liberal Studies in 2009. Students get opportunities to learn courses like Communication, Management, Humanities and Performing Arts and to identify and develop their hidden potential. PDU has excellent infrastructure, residential facilities and stimulating environment to support the all-round development of the students.

Liberal Studies is not just about merely teaching a subject to the students but to provide an atmosphere where students acquire a love for learning a subject and subsequently apply their knowledge in their pursuits. It emphasizes on integrated development in teaching, experiential learning and overall grooming of the students in areas of leadership, teamwork, communication skills, thinking skills and being a responsible global citizen to cater to the needs of the diverse world of work. It has been taught in world-renowned universities of North America and Europe for over 100 years on the same campus alongside Engineering and Management Schools to provide interdisciplinary learning opportunities to students. 1. AREAS OFFERED-:

A. MASTER OF ARTS PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION

Relevance of Public Administration has grown immensely since the inception of human civilization, its role has increased and changed from doer/provider to regulator of services in the present times. With the present and future perspective on demand-driven administrative processes in sight, a two – year master’s degree programme in Public Administration with a focus on Public Policy and Governance is being offered by the School of Liberal Studies, PDU.

The curriculum of this Masters Programme covers all cotemporary and conventional areas of Public Administration i.e. theories (traditional to contemporary), Indian administration, internal security, rural development, disaster management, social welfare & social accountability, Economic & Financial administration, Public enterprises, Non-profit administration etc. The course is supportive for students aspiring to chart out careers in globally competitive public and private sector, career planning for various social science research institutes and civil services. Those who desire to pursue higher studies may join research programmes in areas/disciplines such as Public Administration, Development Studies, Local Self-government, Rural Development, Urban Governance & Management, Public Policy, Development Politics, Law & Governance, Sociology, Political Science, etc.

B. MASTER OF ARTS POLITICAL SCIENCE-INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS

The two-year Post Graduation degree in Political Science-International Relations focuses on imparting comprehensive knowledge on International Relations while blending it with vital aspects of Political Science. The curriculum is prepared in a manner to train students with the fast-changing developments at the global level, nurture orientations in strategic affairs, and expose students to new horizons in the field of global affairs.

The programme offers specialization in the areas of diplomacy, national and global security, Energy Politics, Political Economy, Geopolitics, etc. With custom designed curriculum structure, along with internships and publication training, the course intends to prepare students to fit into the contemporary demands of the academic, administrative, corporate, diplomacy domains.

C. MASTER OF ARTS ENGLISH

A two – year master’s degree programme in English, designed as per the model course curriculum of UGC prepared to challenge the creativity and imagination of students. The programme opens up an entire panorama of visual arts, theatre arts, science, psycho- analysis, philosophy and films with reference to English. PDU infrastructure supports the unique pedagogy required to deliver such a programme.

D. MASTER OF ARTS - PSYCHOLOGY

A two-year master’s degree programme in Psychology- Applied Psychology is aimed at imparting application aspects of psychological concepts across various aspects of work and life. Through this program students will develop an understanding of how psychological theories are applied to real world situations. The course will focus on applying psychological concepts, theories, and processes to the fields of health, business, society, spirituality, and education. Techniques to evaluate contemporary local and global issues and topics using an applied psychological Perspective will be integrated in the teaching pedagogy. Further the course will also focus on making the student more job ready in various areas at Individual, team and societal level. Societal development will be one of the significant focus area of this program which can be aligned easily with mission and vision of Pandit Deendayal Petroleum University. MA in Psychology will also facilitate the scope for the centres of excellence in specializations of psychology relating to specific sectors such as health, youth, disability and social justice, entrepreneurship and leadership; and for developing standardized psychological assessment procedures. Teaching pedagogy for this course includes lectures, workshop, field projects, guest talks, field visits, internships and practical lab work. In the final year Students also required to submit two dissertations. Students’ performance is evaluated through class assignments, mid –semester & end-semester exams, internships and dissertation are taken into account. This holistic approach to learning facilitates students in understanding the various theories and also to apply learnt concepts in the real-world situations.



2. ADMISSION RULES AND REGULATION

2.1 The admission process for Master of Arts Programme for the batch of 2018-20 will be conducted under the direction of the Admission Committee constituted by the University for School of Liberal Studies headed by the Director – SLS.

2.2 Total Number of Seats for admission in each area is limited to **20**.

2.3 **Statutory Reservation:** For candidate from Indian States & UT's:

- Scheduled Tribe (ST) 7.5%
- Scheduled Caste (SC) 15 %
- Physically Challenged will be provided 3% reservation in each category

3. ADMISSION PROCESS - ONLINE APPLICATION PROCESS

3.1 The Applicant should apply on-line on SLS website. (Please visit SLS website www.sls.pdu.ac.in for application procedure.)

3.2 Applicant can opt for (**only one**) subject/discipline from Public Administration/Political Science - International Relations /English/Psychology for pursuing the Master's Programme.

3.3 For the purpose of registration, applicant shall be required to pay a sum of Rs. **500.00** through **Internet Banking/Debit Card/Credit Card** towards the **Registration Fee**.

3.4 The **Application Fee is non-refundable and no correspondence on this subject will be entertained**.

3.5 An applicant shall be required to upload the colour scan copies of requisite certificates and testimonials as specified in the Application Form.

3.6 The last date to apply online is 12.00 AM (Midnight) of **7th July 2018**.

3.7 The applicant will carry the printout of the 'Admit Card' to the venue of examination, and get it signed by the invigilator in PDU.

3.8 The applicants to all programmes under various reserved category must submit along with application form the attested photocopies of certificate for verification of reserved category issued by the competent authority. These certificates should be in English or with authorized English translation.

3.9 The last date for receiving the application form is **7th July 2018**.

4. ELIGIBILITY

4.1 Applicant must have a Bachelor's Degree in any discipline from any recognized College/University in India.

4.2 The students expecting their qualifying degree result on/ before 31st August 2018 can also apply.

5. SELECTION PROCEDURE

5.1 An entrance test followed by an interview will be conducted on **8th July 2018**.

5.2 Entrance test consists of both objective and descriptive type of questions.

5.3 Entrance test shall be conducted on **8th July 2018 at 11: 00 AM**. It will evaluate the applicant's competence in the areas of General Studies, English / Political Science -International Relations / Public Administration / Psychology, as per the preference in the application form.

5.4 The test will have **50 multiple-choice type** questions to be answered in **60 minutes** and **Essay question-**descriptive type in **30 minutes**.



5.5 There is **No Negative Marking** in the Objective type Questions.

5.6 The **first section** of general studies section would be of **20 Marks** containing **20 questions** which are common for all the subjects.

5.7 The **second section** of subject specific questions would be of **30 Marks** containing **30 questions** for each offered discipline.

5.8 The third Section of Essays containing **25 Marks** would be from the subject/areas of

Public Administration: - Contemporary issues of Administration, Polity, Governance, Issues of National and International significance from administrative perspective, Public Policy and Administration.

Political Science - International Relations: - Foreign Relation, Political Science, Politics and Issues of National and International significance from International Relations perspective.

English: - Questions related to Literature in general.

Psychology: -Applications of Psychological concepts in daily life/work

5.9 Interview and Statement of Purpose:

5.10 Written Test will be followed by an interview of **25 marks** to assess the thematic understanding, clarity and communications skills of the candidates. The candidates should submit a statement of purpose in about **250 words** explaining the purpose for pursuing the **MA programme**. The interview will be conducted in the post lunch session.

5.11 **Merit Marks:** Merit Marks shall be the summation of marks obtained in

- i) Multiple Choice test
- ii) Essay
- iii) Interview

5.12 Merit List shall be prepared in the descending order of merit marks.

6. TEST ADMINISTRATION

6.1 Applicants are to report at the venue at least **45 minutes** before the scheduled time of the commencement of the test.

6.2 No applicant shall be admitted **15 minutes** after the commencement of the test. Also, no extra time shall be granted for completing the test.

6.3 For applicants who are unable to write because of temporary or permanent disability, a writer will be made available. **The request for this should be made in advance.**



7. Applicants shall bring the following when reporting at the test centre:

Documents: Admit Card printout & Proof of payment of application form fee.

Writing Materials: Ball Point Pen, HB Pencils, Eraser, Sharpener.

8. NOTE (INSTRUCTIONS FOR WRITTEN TEST)

8.1 You will be provided a sealed Question Booklet and an Answer Sheet. Please do not open the Question Booklet until announced.

8.2 Please fill up the necessary information in the space provided on the cover of the Question Booklet and the Answer Sheet before commencement of the test.

8.3 The applicants should sign the attendance sheet during the test duly endorsing the Question Booklet series as given on the Question Booklet and other details.

8.4 The duration of the test is **1½ hours (90 Minutes)**. All MCQ questions are compulsory. Each question has four options.

8.5 Answers are to be marked on the Answer Sheet, which will be provided separately. Choose the correct option as you perceive and darken the oval completely, corresponding to (1), (2), (3) or (4) against the relevant question number. Use only HB Pencil to darken the oval for answering.

8.6 Please do not darken more than one oval against any question, as scanner will reject the answer. If you wish to change any answer, erase completely the one already marked and darken the fresh oval with an HB pencil.

8.7 All applicants submitting “Application Forms” along with requisite payment by the due date will be given Application Numbers. You ought to confirm your Roll Number allotted from the website www.pdpu.ac.in under School of Liberal Studies section.

8.8 You must make your own arrangements for reaching the School premises in time for written exam. All expenses for attending written test are to be borne by the applicants.

8.9 Based on the aggregate marks in written test and essay, the first merit list will be put up on the website on **12th July 2018**. The selected applicants are required to complete admission formalities including payment of fees and enrolment procedure by **20th July 2018** for securing admission.

8.10 The second merit list, if needed, will be declared on PDU website on **25th July 2018**.

8.11 The students offered admission in the second merit are required to complete admission formalities by **26th July 2018** to secure admission.

8.12 If a selected applicant fails to secure admission as mentioned in the above, the admission offer will stand cancelled and the seat falling vacant shall be offered to the next waitlisted applicant.

9. CANCELLATION OF ADMISSION/ REFUND OF FEES

9.1 Cancellation of admission by the University:

9.1.1 In case the applicant fails to produce original documents within the specified time period **only deposits** (Rs.13, 000/-) shall be refundable.

9.1.2 During verification of documents or subsequently, at any point of time if the University finds any certificate or testimonial or information submitted by any applicant is incorrect or false, the candidature



of such applicant shall be cancelled for that year. For such applicants only deposit of (Rs.13, 000/-) shall be refundable.

- 9.1.3 If the University is satisfied that a certain applicant on no fault of his has been wrongly admitted, fees & deposits paid if any, for the ongoing semester shall be refundable.

9.2 Cancellation of admission by the applicant or his guardian or authorized representative

- 9.2.1 If an applicant applies for cancellation of his admission through email/in-person the fees paid shall be refunded after deduction of Rs. 1000/- as administrative charges, provided such vacated seat gets filled up.
- 9.2.2 The above referred refund of fees against cancellation of admission is applicable uniformly irrespective of when the applicant has got admission.
- 9.2.3 The refund will be made on 15th October 2018 after receiving all required documents from the candidate in this regard.
- 9.2.4 The candidate shall be required to submit the original receipt of the fees paid for refund in the prescribed form. The application for cancellation is to be submitted to: Admin office – SLS – D Block

10.2 Hostel and Mess Facilities: (charges will be subject to upward revision for current intake.)

- a) Hostel accommodation is available on first come first serve basis, subject to its availability.
- b) To secure the hostel accommodation, following fees are required to be paid. These fees are non-refundable & subject to revision from time to time.

- C) **Mess Charges***: Rs. **41,500/-** per year for breakfast, lunch, dinner and snacks as per canteen schedule. This is compulsory for candidates opting for hostel facility of the University.
- D) For day scholars Rs. **27,500/-** per year for breakfast, lunch and snacks as per the canteen schedule. (Monday to Friday)
- * The above-mentioned Hostel Fees / Mess Charges are to be paid through a Demand Draft drawn in favour of 'Pandit Deendayal Petroleum University', payable at Ahmedabad at the start of academic year.

10.3 Payment Schedule:

- **Payment for Securing Admission**: The candidates who are offered admission can secure the admission only upon payment of the full fees of the first semester.
- **Payment of the remaining charges**: The admitted students are required to pay the mess charges and energy charges for the first semester before the prescribed date.
- **Semester wise Payment**: The admitted students are required to pay the fees of every semester one week before the commencement of the respective semester. In case of delay, penalty will be charged as per the prescribed rules of the School.

10.4 Modes of Payment:

- Payment by Demand Draft: Fees may be paid by demand draft drawn in favour of "Pandit Deendayal Petroleum University," payable at Ahmedabad, Gujarat.
- The said demand draft will be accepted by the Admission Office as per stipulated schedule
 - Payment through Institute Bank Account: Fees can be paid in the University Account at **Oriental Bank of Commerce (OBC) A/C No. 09332151005094**. (IFSC) Code: ORBC0100933,
 - Branch: Gandhinagar. Students are required to send fee payment receipt slip of the bank in scan copy to slsadmission@pdpu.ac.in before the last date.
- Cash Payment: The University and its Schools do not accept cash payment.



11. MERIT CUM MEANS SCHOLARSHIP SCHEME:

11.1 The scholarship is based on the Merit cum Means. The scheme is applicable to MA students securing admission in Academic Year 2018.

11.2 In all **Two meritorious** students from each stream of MA are eligible for Merit cum Means Scholarship.

11.3 The basic eligibility criteria may be the Total Annual Income (from all Sources) of the student's family should not be exceeding Rs. **10.00 Lacs**.

11.4 There would be a waiver of 50% of tuition fee and 50% waiver of Hostel accommodation rent for scholarshipholders till the continuation of such scholarship.

11.5 Hostel accommodation rent waiver will be applicable to the outstation students only.

11.6 In case of a tie between two students the amount of scholarship will be equally divided.

11.7 The students availing the benefit of scholarship are required to work as Teaching Assistant for 10 hours per week.

Eligibility criteria for the award of merit cum means scholarship scheme in the first semester: -

11.8 Fifty (50%) of the marks secured in graduation examination and Fifty (50 %) of the marks obtained in MA entrance examination subject to overall **minimum 65% marks will be considered for the scholarship in the first semester.**

Eligibility criteria for the award of merit cum means scholarship scheme from the second semester onwards: -
To become eligible for the continuance of the scholarship in subsequent semesters, the students are required: -

11.9 To have earned Minimum **SPI of 7.5** in the 1st Semester, and also of **7.5 SPI** in every subsequent semester.

11.10 To have passed every semester examination at the first attempt besides regular attendance, disciplined and exemplary behaviour and compliance with all other norms, as prescribed by the University from time to time.

11.11 To continue availing the scholarship scheme in second and onward semesters' the student has to apply along with the result of the previous semester in a prescribed form wherein authentic information about the family income and other relevant information shall have to be furnished.

11.1 SCHOLARSHIP SCHEME FOR SLS STUDENTS:

11.1.1 Applicant if students of PDU, both graduating or graduated shall be entitled for a 40% of waiver in tuition fees.

11.1.2 A student is entitled to avail either of one scholarship schemes based on the eligibility criteria and prevailing norms.

11.1.3 The students availing the benefit of scholarship are required to work as Teaching Assistant for 10 hours per week.

12. INTERPRETATIONS AND CHANGE OF ADMISSION RULES:

In the matter of interpretation of Admission Policies and Procedures, scholarship schemes, grant and withdrawal of admission the decision of the Admission Committee shall be final and binding on the candidates. The Admission Committee is authorized to resolve issues that are not covered in the Admission Policies and Procedures mentioned above, on the merit of the cases, and implement the same.

13. OTHER IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

13.1 All communications by School of Liberal Studies for the admission process will be made through SLS website www.pdu.ac.in. Candidates are strongly recommended to access the School's website on regular basis for admission updates.



13.2 The Admission Committee has the right to cancel any admission that has been given by the Admission Committee.

13.3 The Admission Committee has the right to cancel any admission taken by the candidate on the basis of incorrect/ insufficient information.

13.4 On admission, the candidate will have to produce his original documents along with one attested copy (by a Gazetted Officer/Head of the Institution last attended) required for the verification by Admission Committee for verification.

14. WARNING AGAINST RAGGING:

Ragging is completely banned at the University. As directed by the UGC also under the instructions of the Supreme Court, students are prohibited from indulging into any kind of ragging inside and outside the University campus. The Anti-Ragging Committee of the University is authorized to take very strict actions against the students indulging into Ragging; including expulsion from the University. The students shall have to submit an undertaking in the prescribed proforma along with the signature of their parent/guardian to the effect that they are aware of the severity of the offences related to the Ragging.

15. CONDITION PRECEDENT:

The above procedure is subject to modification whenever found necessary by the University. If a dispute arises regarding any of the above provisions, the decision of the Director General of the University shall be final and binding to all.

16. JURISDICTION:

The above referred Admission Policy and Procedure is subject to the jurisdiction of Hon'ble Court of Gujarat at Ahmadabad.
